The EOC Situational Awareness and Common Operational Picture Course builds on FEMA's Advanced Situational Awareness (SA) and Common Operating Picture (COP) course E143 by combining the fundamentals of SA and COP with in depth explanations, discussions, and best practices for achieving SA and COP in the EOC.

1. Participants should be emergency management or response personnel who are currently assigned to an EOC.
2. Previous course completion of IS-700, IS-800, ICS-100 and ICS-200 is preferred.
